### **„WILL THE CO<sub>2</sub> BORDER TAX AFFECT THE FUTURE OF LITHUANIAN FARMS?“**

The CO<sub>2</sub> border tax, known as CBAM, is a new environmental tax applied to certain goods imported into the EU based on the CO<sub>2</sub> footprint of these goods. One type of goods is fertilizers, which are still widely used in Lithuanian farms. During the seminar, we will review fertilizer import statistics and trends, identify the main fertilizer markets, and discuss how CBAM may affect fertilizer prices in the Lithuanian and EU markets. We will discuss the possible impact of CBAM on Lithuanian farm costs and look for alternatives to adapt to the changes.
